“Forestry based Carbon Markets in rural West Africa”

Background

Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and forest Degradation (REDD+) can represent a novel source of income for developing countries. But forest conservation can be costly and may also reduce the population’s access to forest and land resources with potential negative income effects.

The successful candidate is expected to assess the impacts of forest conservation with respect to forest cover and distributional effects in the West African Sudanian Savannah region.

The scholarship is part of the newly created West African Science Service Center on Climate Change and Adapted Land Use (WASCAL). For more information see <http://www.wascal.org/>.

Duration and conditions

Starting from October 1, 2013, the initial scholarship will be for 12 months and can be extended for up to three years. The awarded scholarship will cover living, research as well as travel costs.

Time plan

The successful candidate will participate in the interdisciplinary and disciplinary courses of the ZEF Doctoral Studies Program from October 2013 - February 2014 in Bonn. (S)he will develop an individual research proposal until April 2013. Depending on the data requirements of the proposed research the work may entail 6-9 months of field work in West Africa. During the analysis and writing-up period of the dissertation, the candidate will be based at ZEF in Bonn.

Requirements

- Very good degree (Diploma or Master) in agricultural economics, forest economics, environmental economics or related field.
- Very good knowledge of English and good knowledge of French.
- Work experience in developing countries is of advantage.

Application

The eligible candidates are invited to send their application including

- A letter of motivation
- Curriculum vitae
- Copies of all relevant transcripts and certificates of bachelor, master or equivalent courses
- Copies of the master/diploma thesis and scientific publications if available
- Recommendation letters and contact details of two referees
